

2006-07 Fisheries & Wildlife Graduate Scholarships

Neil Armantrout Graduate Fellowship, \$1,000 awarded to a graduate student conducting research on wild salmon.

H. Richard Carlson Memorial Scholarship, \$1,500 awarded to a graduate student with research emphasis in marine fisheries biology.

Coombs-Simpson Memorial Scholarship, \$600 awarded to a female graduate student for leadership and service to university and community. Nominations by graduate students.

Hugo Krueger Graduate Research Award in Fish Physiology, \$1,500 awarded to a graduate student performing fish physiology research. Nominations by faculty.

Mastin Graduate Student Fund, \$3,500, several awards to support research or travel for graduate students when no other funds are available.

Munson Wildlife Graduate Scholarship, \$1,000, awarded to a graduate student with an interest in interdisciplinary natural resources management and research. May be used for travel, supplies, etc.

Oregon Council of Federation of Fly Fishers Scholarship, two awards at \$1,500 to graduate students researching native fishes of interest to the Oregon Council.

Sunriver Anglers Club Scholarship, two awards at \$1,500 to graduate students conducting research on fish or habitat ecology in Eastern Oregon. Preference to Oregon residents.

Middle Rogue Steelheaders, two awards at \$1,000 to students conducting research in habitat or species restoration, Oregon residents, minimum cumulative GPA 3.25.

Thomas G. Scott Achievement Award: \$8000, multiple awards to outstanding M.S. students; and outstanding Ph.D. students; to recognize research potential in graduate students majoring in Fisheries and Wildlife.

Thomas G. Scott Grant for Publication, \$4,000, multiple awards to support publication costs given per year. All students and faculty in the Department of Fisheries & Wildlife are eligible to apply. Apply anytime.

Ted Thorgaard Student Research Fund, \$500 awarded to an undergraduate or graduate student conducting research in conservation biology. May be used for travel, supplies, or other expenses.

Washington County Flyfishers, \$2000 awarded to a senior or graduate student conducting research on freshwater salmonid ecology and management.
